



## Bridgend Town Cricket Club Code of Conduct / set of rules for Young People

**Bridgend Town Cricket Club** is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all its members.

**Bridgend Town Cricket Club** believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents/carers or guardians associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others.

Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with any or all of the following Club Officers:

This specific code of conduct applies to all members of the club under the age of eighteen.

As a member of **Bridgend Town Cricket Club** you are expected to abide by the following junior code of conduct:

- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager. For both training and matches members must use Safety Helmets as defined by British Standard (BS7928:1998). For match-play members must wear white trousers, shirts, cricket shoes and jumpers, ideally in the club colours, and if not fielding close to the wicket caps or cricket hats. For practice members may wear cricket clothing and/or tracksuit bottoms and trainers (spikes may not be used in nets) and training tops.
- Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- All members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
